BASES

A base morpheme is the part of the word that has the principal meaning.

- Most of bases are free morphemes, but some are bound. A word may contain one base and several affixes.
- Enlighten light(free base)
- Darkness......dark(free base)
- writings.....writing(free base)
- Gracefullygrace (free base)



• A bound base: is a base which has the principal meaning of the word, but it cannot be uttered alone as a word in English as they come mostly from other languages like Latin and Greek.

- Reject...... ject (bound base)re (bound morpheme (affix))
- Intervene..... vene (bound base).....inter (bound morpheme (affix))
- Aquatic aqua (bound base).....tic (bound morpheme (affix))
- Comprehend..... prehend (bound base)..... com (bound morpheme (affix))
- Polygamy......gamy (bound base)..... poly (bound morpheme (affix))

Note/ you can find the meaning of bound bases in the exercises 8.5 and 8.6. They are very important.

- bibliophile...... biblio+ phile (two bound bases)
- geography geo + graphy (two bound bases)
- notebook...... note+ book (two free bases)
- fireman..... fire+ man (two free bases)
