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• There are only (9) inflectional Affixes in English, they are:

THE STEM

- The stem is the base or the bases with all derivational affixes(if the word contains any derivational suffixes or prefixes) without any inflectional affixes.
- The inflectional suffixes and infixes are attached to the stem
- The stem of dark
 is dark
- The stem of (playboys) is playboy
- The stem of (beautified) is beautify
- The stem of (wrote) is write
