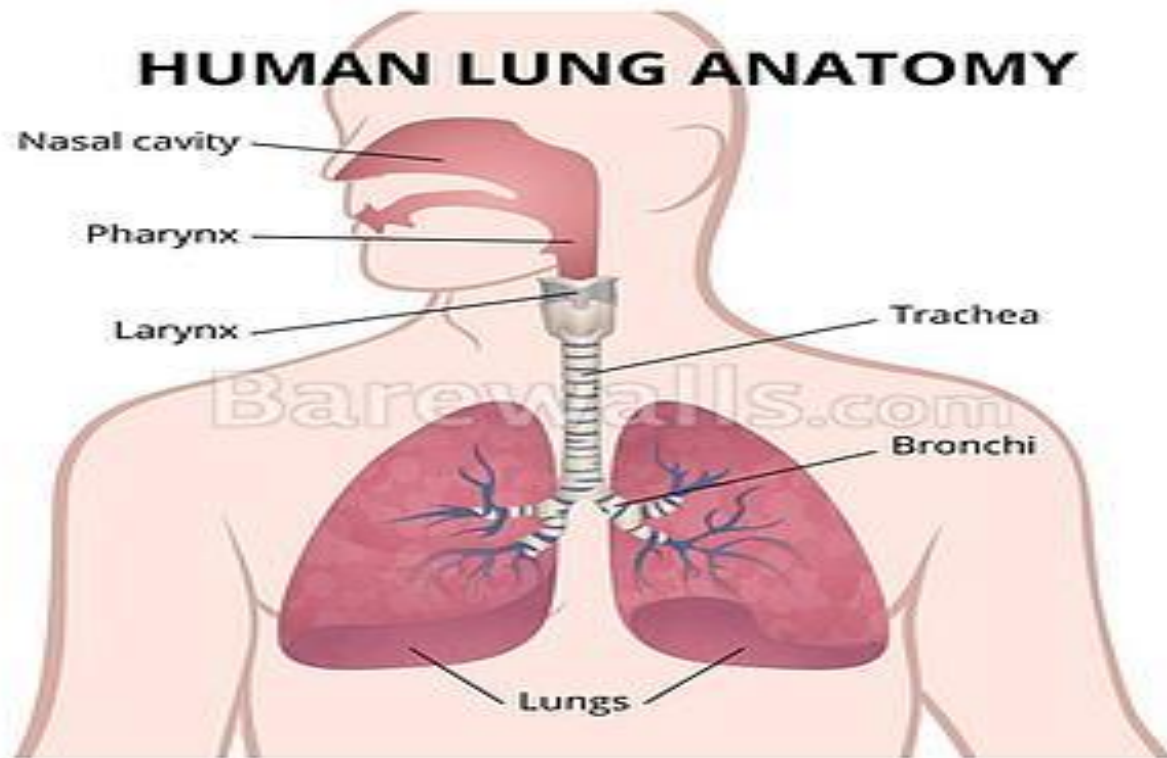

The Lungs

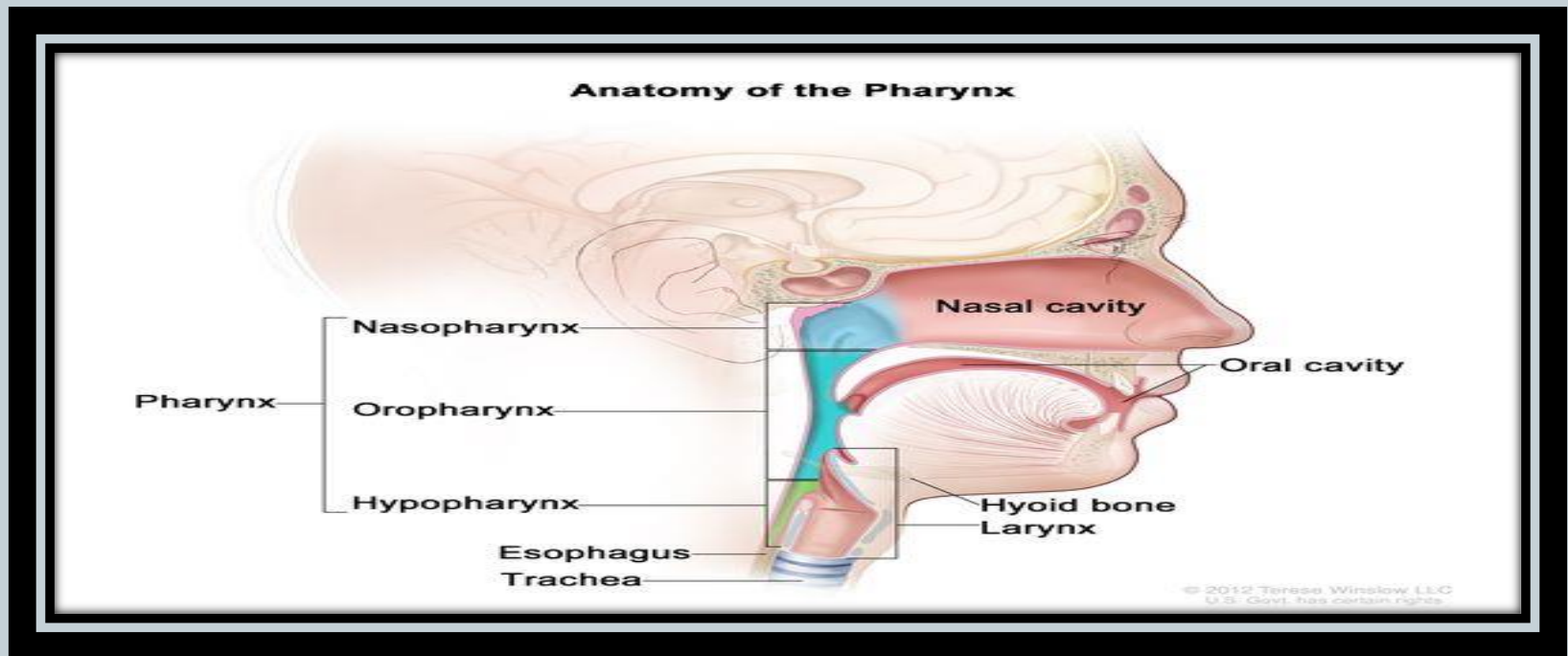


- In all languages, we speak with air from lungs. We draw it into lungs quickly and we released it slowly and then interfere with its passage in various ways and at various places.

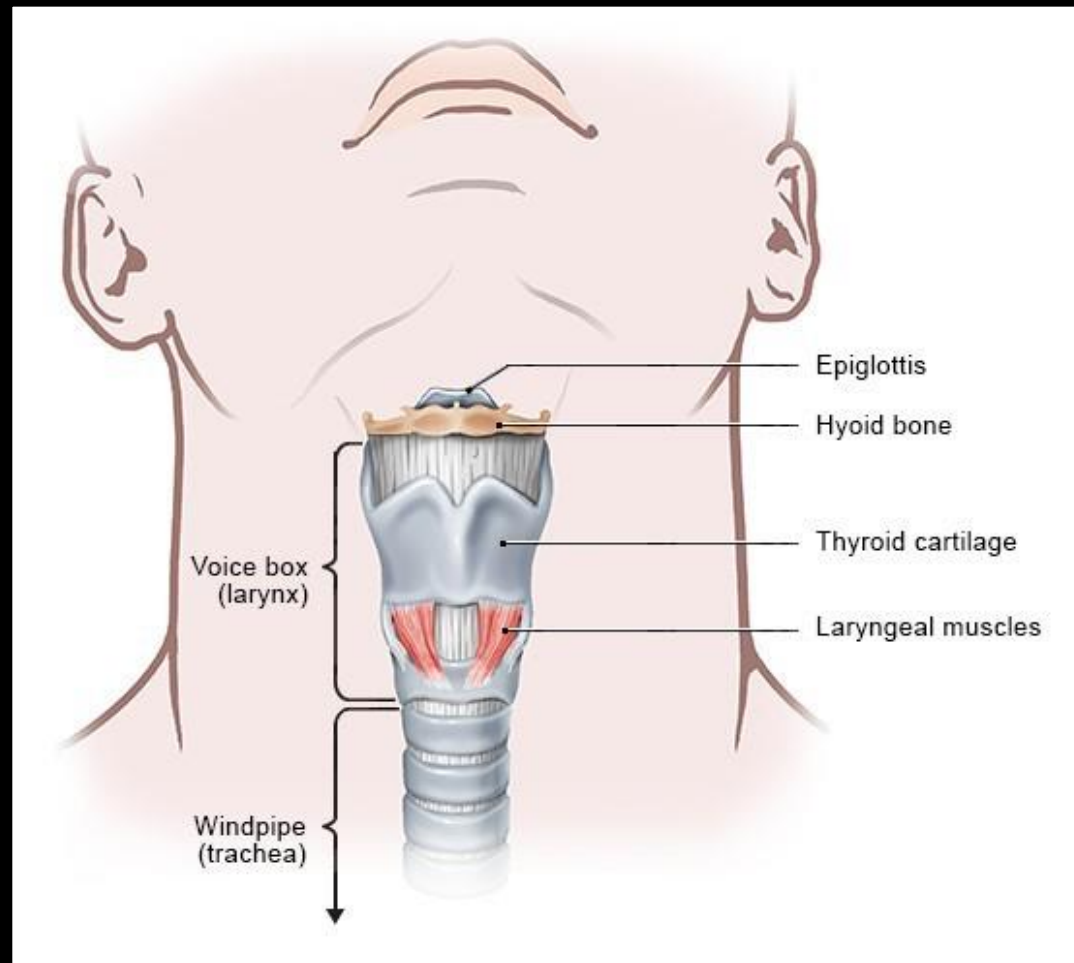
Pharynx
