





## **Positive and Negative**









> An action that happens again and again (a habit)

I **play** football every day.

He goes to work by car.

 $\succ$  A fact that always true

Light travels at almost 300,000 kilometers per second.

The human body **contains** 206 bones.

 $\succ$  A fact that is true for a long time (a state)

She works in a factory.

### **Spelling:**

Verb + -s

 $\checkmark$  Most verbs add –s the base form of the verb. helps writes eats  $\checkmark$  Add –es to verbs that end in ss, sh, ch, x, and o. washes watches fixes goes  $\checkmark$  Verbs that end in a consonant+-y change the y to ies. tries carries worries flies But verbs that end in a Vowel + -y only add -s. buys stays plays

• How often does an action takes place in your life.

• They always study after class.	100%
• He usually walk to work.	90%
• She normally goes to sleep at 9 p.m.	80%
• I often spend weekends at home.	70%
• Sometimes I watch movies.	50%
• We only meet occasionally.	30%
• He seldom goes to the library.	10%
• I rarely listen to the radio.	5%
• He never goes to gym.	0%

• We often use adverbs of frequency with the present simple.



• They go before the main verb, but after the verb *be*.

I **usually** start class at 8.30. I don't **often** go to bed late. She **never** eats meat. I **rarely** see Ali these days.

They're **usually** in a hurry in the morning. I'm **not often** late for school. He's **never** late. We're **rarely** at home at the weekends. • Sometimes and usually can also go at the beginning or the end.

Sometimes we play basketball.

We play basketball sometimes.

Usually I go shopping with my family. I go shopping with my family usually.

• Every day, etc. goes at the end

He phones his mother *every night*.

## **Present simple and future time**

We also use the present simple to talk about:

 $\checkmark$  something that is **fixed** in the future:

The school term **starts** next week. The train **leaves** at 19.45 this evening. We **fly** to Paris next week.

✓ something in the future **after time words** like *when*, *after* and *before*.

and after *if* and *unless* 

I'll talk to John when I see him.You must finish your work before you go home.If it rains we'll get wet.He won't come unless you ask him.

# We sometimes use the present simple to talk about the **past** when we are:

**Telling a story:**

I was walking down the street the other day when suddenly this man **comes up** to me and **tells** me he **has lost** his wallet and **asks** me to lend him some money. Well, he **looks** a bit dangerous so I'm not sure what to do and while we **are standing there**...
