10. Graduate Teaching Assistants are required to inform the Faculty Human Resources Office, through their Deans of Faculty, of any periods of illness whether in semester or in vacation, during which they are eligible for Statutory Sick Pay or sickness benefit under the Housing Benefits and Social Security Acts. The amounts which they are entitled to receive as Statutory Sick Pay will be offset by the University against contractual sick pay and recovered by the University from the Inland Revenue. Any sickness benefits payable after the expiry of Statutory Sick Pay will be deducted from salary. It is the responsibility of the individual Graduate Teaching Assistants to obtain the necessary Medical Certificates when required and to forward claims for sickness benefit to the Faculty Human Resources Office.

11. The Security Council has primary responsibility, under the Charter, for the maintenance of international peace and security. It is so organized as to be able to function continuously, and a representative of each of its members must be present at all times at United Nations Headquarters. On 31 January 1992, the first ever Summit Meeting of the Council was convened at Headquarters, attended by Heads of State and Government of 13 of its 15 members and by the Ministers for Foreign Affairs of the remaining two. The Council may meet elsewhere than at Headquarters; in 1972, it held a session in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, and the following year in Panama City, Panama. When a complaint concerning a threat to peace is brought before it, the Council's first action is usually to recommend to the parties to try to reach agreement by peaceful means. In some cases, the Council itself undertakes investigation and mediation. It may appoint special representatives or request the Secretary-General to do so or to use his good offices. It may set forth principles for a peaceful settlement.
