

## Present continuous Tense

Is used to refer something that happen now or in the future.

The form of present continuous tense is (Sub. +V+ing+ comp.)

The form of plural subject (We, they) = are

Except the subject (you) it take (are) for both, single and plural

### Affirmative (المثبت)

- 1- I = am working.
- 2- He/ she= is working.
- 3- We/ they = are working
- 4- You = are working

### Negative المنفي

- I am not  
He/she is not  
They/ we are not  
You / are

### Question

Are → you/ they/ we

Is → he/she

Uses of present continuous tense

- Talking about what **happen now** , at **the moment of speak**
  - 1- He is making a phone call
  - 2- I am watching a T.V
  - 3- They are writing the home work
- Talking about what happen **but** not exactly at the moment of speak
  - 1- I am looking for a job
  - 2- You are spending a lot of money these days
- Talking about what we **already arrangement** or **plan to do in the future** and we use these adverbs (**Next week, morning, Saturday, in October, this evening**)
  - 1- What are you doing this evening ?
  - 2- I'am starting my new job on Saturday
  - 3- We are traveling next month

**Important note:** Be attention, there are some **verbs are not using in present continuous**. They are normally used in simple form. The most important ones are: **(like, know, love, hate, understand, believe, mean, remember, want, prefer)**

- 1- I'm liking basketball = I like basketball
- 2- I am hating the car = I hate the car
