The derivational and the inflectional paradigm

- The derivational paradigm a set of related words with the same <u>base</u> and different derivational affixes.
- Man manly, manhood, mannish, unman, unmanly,...
- Teach teacher teachable teachability teachableness,.....
- The inflectional paradigm......a set of related words with the same <u>stem</u> and different inflectional affixes.
- Man men man's men's
- Teach teaches teaching taught taught
- Teacher teachers teachers'



Types of inflectional paradigms

There are four inflectional paradigms:

- 1- Noun paradigm
- 2- Pronoun paradigm
- 3- Verb paradigm
- 4- Comparable paradigm



1- Noun paradigm: stem(noun) + -S pl -S sg ps -S pl ps

Noun Paradigm



The stem	pl	sg ps	pl ps
bird	birds	bird's	birds'
mouse	mice	Mouse's	Mice's
worker	workers	Worker's	Workers'



- 2- **Pronoun paradigm:** is a small and closed set of words with fixed forms (no stem and affix combination)
- The members of a pronoun paradigm are four. They are classified according to (subject, object, prenominal possessive, and substitutional possessive)
