

## Pattern 5: (N<sup>1</sup> Lv N<sup>1</sup>)

- In this pattern the verb is a linking verb (Lv) which links the noun before and the noun after it.
- Both N1 s refer to the same person or thing. The second N1 is the subject complement of the first N1 which is the subject of the sentence.

e.g. Jim became a doctor.  $\longrightarrow$  Jim (N1) became (Lv) a doctor (N1)

 The linking verbs that occupy the verb position in this pattern are limited to few verbs including: (remain, become, appear, seem, continue, stay, and make)



## Examples of pattern 5

	N <sup>1</sup>	Lv	N <sup>1</sup>
Frank became an engineer.	Frank	became	an engineer
A fruit cake makes a fine gift.	A fruit cake	makes	a fine gift
Corona virus stays a big danger to the whole world.	Corona virus	stays	a big danger
The chief didn't seem a good fellow	The chief	Didn't seem	a good fellow



NOTE: Sentences that follow pattern 5 in which  $N^1 = N^1$  should not be confused with sentences in which the two Ns do not refer to the same person or thing.

- A fruit cake makes a fine gift. (a fruit cake = a fine gift) ......pattern 5
- My sister makes a delicious fruit cake. (my sister # delicious fruit cake)......pattern 7

- Ann continued my best friend since childhood. (Ann = my best friend ) ......pattern 5
- Ann continued reading the new novel. (Ann ≠ reading the new novel).....pattern 7
