Pattern 8: N¹ TrV N² N³

- $N^1 \neq N^2 \neq N^3$: N^1, N^2, N^3 have different referents.
- <u>My mother bought me a dress</u>. (my mother ≠ me ≠ a dress)
- The verbs that can be used in this pattern is a small group including: give, make, find, send, build, teach, sell, pay, buy, play, write, feed, offer, pass,...
- •
- In this pattern the transitive verb is followed by two objects: the indirect object (IO) and the direct object (DO) respectively.



Examples of pattern 8

- •<u>Ann</u> <u>gave</u> <u>her brother</u> a <u>mobile phone</u>
- • N^{1} TrV N² (IO) N³ (DO)
- y<u>ou</u> <u>owe</u> <u>me</u> <u>some money</u>.
- N¹ TrV N² (IO) N³ (DO)

• <u>I</u> <u>will buy</u> <u>her</u> <u>a book</u> <u>tomorrow</u>.

- N¹ TrV N² (IO) N³ (DO) (Av)
- <u>The nurse might have told him the decision this moment.</u>
 N¹ TrV N² (IO) N³ (DO) (Av)



Note 1: If the first object (the IO) is removed, the pattern will become (7)

- I sent <u>my mother</u> a flower.
- N¹ TrV N² (IO) N³
- I sent a flower.
- N¹ TrV N²
- She asked you a simple question.
 N¹ TrV N² (IO) N³
- She asked a simple question.
- N¹ TrV N²

Note 2: The indirect object may be replaced by a prepositional phrase beginning with: <u>to</u>, <u>for</u>, or another preposition. In this case the direct object will come immediately after the verb.

I sent <u>you</u> <u>some money</u>. = I sent <u>some money</u> <u>to you</u>. IO DO to+IO

My brother carved \underline{me} a wooden horse. \underline{me} My brother carved a wooden horse \underline{to} me.IODODOto+IO

Ben's grandmother knitted <u>him</u> a sweater. = Ben's grandmother knitted a <u>sweater</u> for him. IO DO for+IO DO for+IO



Note 3: In this pattern two passive sentences are possible (the first sentence begins with the indirect object, the other begins with the direct object)

• She tells him a story every night.

1- He is told a story every night (by her).

2- A story is told to him every night (by her).

I have handed the teacher my assignment.

1- The teacher has been handed my assignment (by me).2-My assignment has been handed to the teacher (by me)

• My father bought me a new book.

1- I was bought a new book (by my father)

2- A new book was bought for me (by my father)
