Adverbs of Frequency

■ How often does an action takes place in your life.

They always study after class.	100%

► He usually walk to work. 90%

She normally goes to sleep at 9 p.m. 80%

■ I often spend weekends at home. 70%

Sometimes I watch movies. 50%

■ We only meet occasionally. 30%

► He seldom goes to the library. 10%

■ I rarely listen to the radio. 5%

He never goes to gym. 0%

■ These adverbs usually come before the main verb.

Sometimes and usually can also come at the beginning or the end of a sentence.

Never and always never come at the beginning or the end of a sentence.

like / love + verb + -ing

When *like* and *love* are followed by another verb, it is usually the –ing form:

She likes cooking.

He loves listening to music.

I don't like studying.
