

S V (Inv)

- A transitive verb is a verb that needs one or more objects to complete its meaning.
 He bought **a car**.
 He bought **her a car**.
- An intransitive verb is a verb that doesn't need an object to complete its meaning.
 It rained.
 She spoke quietly during the meeting.
- Intransitive verbs include verbs like: (sit, stand, smile, agree, arrive, laugh, ...). These verbs can be followed optionally by one or more adverbs.

Examples:

Riots may explode at any time.

Stop!

Who died in the war?

His grandfather was coughing all night.

I could not study last night because of this horrible weather.

The water level has been rising day by day.
