

Vowel Sequences

What is meant by Vowel Sequences?

- When one vowel(or diphthong) follows another you should pronounce each one quite normally but with a smooth glide between them.
- The most common sequences are formed by adding /ə/ to a diphthong .The vowel sequences include the following :
 - /aɪə/, /aʊə/ , /eɪə/ , /ɔɪə/
